Knowledge gained from the PHAROS study and your participation will better help to define the very early clinical signs of HD, improve the understanding of genetic and environmental variables that may have an effect on the onset of HD, provide clinical research methods to the design and conduct therapeutic trials with the goal of postponing the onset of HD, enhance effective care and counseling for adults at immediate (50:50) risk for HD and provide biological resources for future HD research.
